STUDENT RECEPTION

You will have a timetable which will look something like this. It will tell you what lesson you are doing, the room you need to be in and the name of your teacher.


Don't worry about finding your way around - we'll give you a map and there will always be lots of you heading for the same room.

ATTITUDE TO ACHIEVE & REWARD STARS



AN ESSENTIAL PRE-REQUISITE FOR EFFECTIVE TEACHING AND LEARNING

All students should know and understand the system so they know what is expected of them within the classroom.

A1 and **A2** are warnings that their behaviour or attitude is not acceptable.

A3 is a continuation of these attitudes or behaviours and results in an after school Learning Catch Up

AA4 is the most serious sanction and is an automatic removal from the classroom and results in time spent in the Internal Exclusion (IE) room.

DINING ARRANGEMENTS



In partnership with leading school caterers Aspens, we offer a wide range of delicious hot and cold items, including vegan and vegetarian options.

You can choose a baguette or wrap from our popular sandwich bar or at the 'Grab and Go' there's take-away food such as panini's, pizza and sausage rolls. At the hot counter you can choose a full hot dinner with dessert or go for a lighter option of a jacket potato with a choice of fillings or a tasty pasta and sauce pot.

CANTEEN OPENING TIMES

THE CANTEEN IS OPEN AT BREAK AND LUNCH TIMES. WE HAVE A BREAKFAST CLUB TOO, open from 7.45am.

We operate a cashless catering system so that students don't have to carry money around the school.

Every student has their own lunch account identified by a unique pin number and QR code. You will be issued with a QR code* which should be kept safe. We also advise having a picture of it on your mobile phone.

*There is a small fee for replacement QR codes

Money can be added to your account online via Arbor Parent Portal and your guardian will need to have signed up via the invite. Arbor Parent Portal is currently closed but will be open again from late August.

Students should bring a refillable water bottle to school to stay hydrated. There is a filling station in the canteen.

Our popular and well stocked library is looked after by our Raising Achievement Team.


