Quad garden

Sewell Barn Theatre

Links have been re-established, eg all GCSE Performing Arts students have had backstage tours; last term we had a successful Y7 drama workshop supporting *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Although only a small number of students attended the production, they all really enjoyed it. It will take time to rebuild levels of student interest and involvement.

- We held all three traditional raffles (Christmas gifts, Easter eggs and Summer days out) for the first time since before the pandemic. Profits are down, but we need to rebuild these traditions with more student participation

- We held two **Quiz and Chips** evenings, which were very well supported and great fun as usual ... although the June one was far too hot! Sincere thanks to our Librarian Stef Burnett for all her time, effort and commitment as our Quiz Setter Extraordinaire.
